These passages meet the demand for more rigorous, complex texts with Common Core- especially paired texts that students can use to compare and build knowledge to integrate information and draw conclusions. The passages in this set are in the "stretch" range for 3rd and 4th and in the grade level band for 5th grade. There are two styles of passages provided to help suit various needs.

In my 4th grade classroom, I use each of the texts for close reading and annotating lessons- this helps ensure the students fully comprehend the texts before having to answer questions about both texts together. My students use their annotated texts to answer the questions. Since the texts are in the "stretch" range for 3rd and 4th, I don't give these texts as cold reads, but if you have students reading on a 5th grade level, you definitely could! If your students have not been exposed to paired text questions, you may want to walk them through some examples before you ever take a grade.
